MUSINGS FROM REV. JIM

The same person has cut my hair for the last 20 years. Since I started working again, I have been getting my hair cut every five weeks so I can look professional. I had an appointment on Wednesday and arrived at noon. As I walked through the door I said to my hair-cutter/stylist, "it's a very short drive here from Pittsford." She asked, "how is it going at Pittsford Presbyterian Church?" For just a moment I wondered how much I should share. I responded, "it's complicated, but ok." Then I heard, "I belong to that church." Suddenly there was a flush of laughter from everyone, and I introduced myself to my fellow FPC friend, Marilyn Hediger, sitting in the chair next to me. Marilyn gave me permission to share this story. Val, my haircutter/stylist commented, "that just goes to show you should always be careful how much you say, you never know who is listening." Marilyn and I laughed together and she said, "bless your heart for coming to help us." I think we will be friends while I am at FPC.

Marilyn is not the first from the congregation who has said the same, "bless you for coming to help us." Those words give me motivation and inspiration. Thank you. I think we can be confident that the Lord will bless us in the days ahead, as you anticipate the arrival of a new pastor. Your waiting and expectation is an appropriate theme for the Advent season, where we explore that part of our life in Christ, or our spiritual lives, where we wait with expectation for the coming of Christ. I have always found it curious that the number 40 is frequently used in the biblical story to indicate the time needed for God to finish the work he has to do with us. If we quit and walk away at 39 days, months, or years, we have wasted our time. Forty days, months, or years are necessary and until you get there it isn't finished, and the Lord isn't done with us. So welcome to Advent, where we learn again how to wait for the Lord, how to become resilient in hope, and how to allow faith to grow deeper. We need to be a strong, trained team to be ready for the coming of the Lord.

When I met for the first time with the committee that interviewed me, before I had any inclination to help, I got a 'word from the Lord' for FPC. I am not the type that looks or listens, or even expects a 'word from the Lord.' But in the last 17 years working as chaplain at Rochester's psychiatric hospital, I seem to have gotten ears and eyes that capture something that seems from God. Please be patient if this seems peculiar. It may be. So the word which may be from God (I don't know) for FPC Pittsford is like this—two questions. The first is "what do you need from God?" This is not an operational or administrative question, but one that goes more to the power source of our life together in Christ. It requires a corporate discernment, a listening, and prayer to come to some kind of consensus of what is needed from God. It can't be 'more members, more money, or better parking.' It is fine to ask for this from God. We can and should ask for all things from God. But a better vein of asking from God are things like, 'I believe we need more joy in the congregation.' Or 'we need a stronger consensus of mission that moves powerfully outward into the world.' Or 'we need an explosion of love, surprising and coming as a gift into our life and witness together.' So, maybe from God, is this question, "what do you need?"

The second question, related to the first but also very different is, "what do you believe the Lord wants to give you, as a congregation?" What we want from God is frequently different from what God

wants to give us. It is possible that the latter question is stronger for our spiritual lives, for it pulls us up out of our own wonderings and worries. What is the gift God wants to pour into our life together in Christ that will bind up, heal, and spill over into the streets and neighborhoods where we live? God has something he wants to give. And sometimes we miss it because we aren't paying attention. So, I invite you to a corporate discernment, 'what do you need from God,' and 'what is the Lord seeking to give you.'

The last thing that came to my mind before I started here, which may be from God, is "the church needs more joy in the sanctuary." I am not sure what that means, but with all the instruments and voices, we certainly have the potential. I am absolutely fascinated by the notion that when singing in tune, overtones begin to sound that fill up the room, so there is more sound than you are making. So as the director of the chorus I sing in says, "don't try to sing louder, but sing in tune, listen, and surprisingly, 'overtones' begin to sound that fill up all of Kodak Hall." Let's see if we can so sing together in tune that overtones of the Lord sound out and fill the whole sanctuary.

Vital Congregations Initiative

Over the next two years we will be hearing the abbreviation VCI or Vital Congregations Initiative a lot... so, who is involved and what is it? The short answer to who is—all of us. Each of us will have a role in the coming years as we reflect on our role in the church and the community at large. The purpose of The Vital Congregations Initiative is to work alongside leaders of existing congregations continually assessing, discerning, and living into faithful actions that increase vitality through intentional spiritual practices that take them deeper into following Jesus Christ, so that their own lives are changed, congregations are transformed, and the mission of God spreads throughout particular communities and the world. Our VCI Team will work with others from across the presbytery, exploring who we have been and where the spirit is calling us to go. Introductory meetings have already occurred, and we are preparing a Lenten study of the Seven Marks of Vital Congregations, which are:

- Lifelong Discipleship Formation vs. complacent "Christian" piety, simply teaching good morals, or offering the latest program
- Intentional, Authentic Evangelism vs. "Jesus freaks;" "Christian" hypocrisy; a committee
- Outward Incarnational Focus vs. inward institutional survival; closed communities of assimilation/exclusion
- **Empower Servant Leadership** vs. the Pastor's job; monopolized leadership; hiring the young, energetic pastor
- **Spirit-Inspired Worship** vs. self-gratifying worship, stale ritual divorced of meaning, or consumer entertainment worship
- Caring Relationships vs. any other social club; façades, hypocrisy, and judgment of "church" and "religion."
- Ecclesial Health vs. unhealthy dysfunction; toxic environments; obsolete and irrelevant buildings ...Until then if there are any questions about VCI please contact one of the team members below. We look forward to this congregational reflection and growth alongside each of you.
