CHARTING THE COURSE WITH PASTOR AARON

We are doing something a little different this year with Advent. Most years, we read some passages from Matthew's and Luke's Gospels about the birth of Jesus. This makes sense since Matthew and Luke give us the most explicit narratives describing the birth of Jesus. Even John's gospel, in its own way, tells us about the birth of Jesus (John 1:14, "The Word became flesh and lived among us.")

Mark's Gospel, on the other hand, tells us nothing about the young life of Jesus and begins the story with his baptism as an adult. What could Mark's Gospel possibly have to say to us during Advent, the season when we are anticipating the birth of Jesus? It turns out that Mark has a lot to tell us. At least that's what Pastor Erin and I are hoping to convey to you in worship throughout Advent.

The miracle of the birth of Jesus is really about the Incarnation, the fact that, in Jesus, God became flesh and bone. What does the Incarnation of God-the-Son in Jesus Christ mean? It means that God loves the physical universe enough to become a part of it. It means that God understands what it's like to be human, its pain and pleasure, its joy and sorrow, its triumph and tragedy. It means that the physical world is not at odds with the spiritual world, but that both can and do contain goodness and God's presence. All of these things, while not being about Jesus' birth, are only possible because of Jesus' birth.

Throughout Advent, we will be drawing on insights from Mark's Gospel and from the book *Holy Disruption* (which many of you are reading) in order to gain a deeper understanding and appreciation of God's Incarnation in Jesus Christ. Just as Jesus "showed up" in the flesh to be with us 2,000 years ago, I hope you will show up in the flesh some Sunday during Advent.

What is a Blue Christmas Service?

Blue Christmas services typically take place on the winter solstice. This year ours is scheduled for the evening before the solstice. We often think of the winter solstice as the day with the shortest amount of light, but it is also the night with the longest period of darkness. You can choose to attend or participate in a Blue Christmas service for many reasons. Some people come because they are experiencing grief, illness, fractured relationships, depression, anxiety, or any number of other things that make being joyful during the Christmas season difficult. Others may come to support or pray for loved ones who are experiencing a time of difficulty.

It may sound like this service would not fit in with the time hope and celebration we experience at Advent and Christmas, but the purpose of the service is to remind us of the joy that we ALL share in the Incarnation.

"The Incarnation is a reason for celebration that God loved us so much that God sent Jesus to be with us, but it is also a reason for celebration that Jesus came to walk with us through the pains of life as well. I wish we could better hold these two messages together." - Rev. Christa Brewer, FPC Myrtle Beach

2023 Stewardship Campaign Update

The Generosity Committee would like to thank all who have participated to date in our annual Stewardship Campaign. As you all noticed, we had placed a Stewardship Thermometer in the lobby on November 6. This year the Generosity Committee asked the Leadership of the Church (Deacons, Elders and Trustees) to try to get their pledges in by November 3. The thermometer represented \$165,000 which came from 48 pledges as of November 3.

Here is a quick update as of November 14: 107 pledges totaling \$384,607

However, Maria does need a little help as two of the pledge cards that were placed in the Church on Consecration Sunday were anonymous, they are as following:

\$350 – Monthly Contribution = \$4,200 for the year

\$4,850 – Yearly Contribution (also indicated it was from one person) So, if you recognize these pledge amounts and timing, please reach out to Maria in the church office.

Again, the entire Generosity Committee thanks you for your ongoing support and commitment during this year's Stewardship Campaign. We will be updating the thermometer in the lobby as the campaign progresses over the next few weeks as well as the church website. 


