Embracing and Sharing Christ's Love

CHARTING THE COURSE WITH PASTOR AARON

Do you know the context for the book of Deuteronomy? After the people of Israel had wandered in the desert for 40 years, they were about to - finally! - enter the Promised Land. Moses, an old man by this time, gathers the people of Israel together to give them one final speech before they cross over the Jordan River and into Canaan. The book of Deuteronomy is a collection of all the things Moses said to the people in that speech. What did Moses say to them? Well, he encouraged them to trust in God, to obey God, and to remain faithful to the covenant they had made with God. He also reiterates the Laws that God had given to them, and the book ends as Moses reminds them that following the ways of God is good for them.

In a way, it feels a little like First Presbyterian Church is in a situation like the people of Israel. Our Faith Forward initiative is about to reach its culmination at the third Vision Retreat on January 27-28 and the Congregational Debrief on February 11. We had planned to have the third retreat at the beginning of December, but we needed to delay it so our consultant Kevin could be with his mother who is receiving end-of-life care. We have been doing our own "desert wandering" since then as we await this final retreat to happen. The Vision Retreat is like the Jordan River, and on the other side of it, I believe we will be able to see more clearly the future that awaits us.

Like Moses did for the people of Israel, as we prepare to move forward in faith, allow me to encourage us to trust in God, to obey God, and to remain faithful to the covenant God has made with us in Christ. We're told in Ephesians 1:22-2:1, "God has put all things under Christ's feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all." The church is called "the body of Christ" and "the fullness of God." That is quite the description of the church—a high calling and purpose, indeed! How do we live into that calling? We have to allow God to fill us with the Holy Spirit. We have to look to the Head if we are to know what it means to be the Body. As it says later in Ephesians, "We must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love" (4:15-16).

The church's job is to look to Christ, to love him, and to ask for his help as we imitate him. That is, ultimately, what the purpose of Faith Forward is, too. So, as we wait on this side of the Jordan River, let us look to Christ to help us become more faithful and true.
