Reflecting on all the work and continued relationship building with Cameron this past year, heartfelt thanks to you! Your continued outpouring of love for this well-deserving and essential mission is proof that indeed, we can improve the lives of children, teens and adults in Rochester's most under-served areas. Hands-on, all-ages, inclusive mission - that's what we are about.

Our 2023 Highlights with Cameron Community Ministries

Over 2400 meals made from 100% donated food/cash from members or food banks. Nutritious meals are made in Cameron's kitchen on the 2nd Monday and 4th Wednesday of each month by cooking teams of 3-4 volunteers. A volunteer pool of 20 cooks from First Presbyterian Pittsford, Irondequoit Presbyterian and friends staff two teams every month.

Summer Food Drive and Thanksgiving turkey requests yielded several hundred pounds of essentials to assist with increased food demand.

Needle Nellies and others donated hundreds of beautifully-made scarves, hats, mittens, shawls for all ages. These served as special gifts at Cameron's community party.

Presbyterian Women provided hundreds of much-appreciated new undergarments and socks. Throughout the year, carloads of toys, new/likenew clothing, including business clothes and personal hygiene items, were donated through various sources.

Naomi Circle sponsored four Cameron summer campers.

Participation in the Saturday Academy and after-school programs. FPC Youth prepped, served food, and participated in activities. Volunteers provided guitars, music lessons, science/math projects, and homework assistance.

FPC Youth and leaders collaborated with Cameron's Executive Director to build a handicap ramp for a disabled neighborhood resident.

Cameron supporters from Pittsford, Irondequoit, Christ Episcopal and others celebrated Cameron's 40th Anniversary at their April Gala. The Presbytery of Genesee Valley was recognized and commended for its four decades with Cameron Community.

FPC Outreach recognized and acted on the importance of helping fund a new position at Cameron in 2023. The first children's social worker was hired parttime in late 2022 as a trial. This position has proven to be invaluable in teaching children coping skills, understanding difficult situations, one-on-one counseling, and sharing in groups, etc. And, of course, prayers for families, the victims of violence, and Cameron staff were priceless.
