#### Embracing and Sharing Christ's Love

#### CHARTING THE COURSE WITH PASTOR AARON

Today, we remember David as the greatest king of ancient Israel. There is no doubt that he had character flaws. Nevertheless, he trusted God and, under his reign, Israel was united, strong, and prosperous. His kingship was so admired that he became an archetype of the coming Messiah. However, just because it happened that way, doesn't mean it couldn't have happened another way. If the leaders of Israel had really dropped the ball during the transition from Saul to David, we might not even be talking about David today. He might have been a total failure! That's why, in the life of Israel, one of their most critical moments was the transition from the kingship of Saul to the kingship of David.

In 1 Chronicles 12, we're told about all the people who contributed to the safe transition into David's kingship. In fact, we're told that *all twelve tribes* contributed, which is amazing, since the tribes had not been united under Saul. The transition required everyone's support and contribution, and I want to highlight the important role of one tribe in particular. 1 Chronicles 12:32 mentions the tribe of Issachar: "Of Issachar, those *who had understanding of the times, to know what Israel ought to do*, two hundred chiefs, and all their kindred under their command" (emphasis added). The tribe of Issachar had the important job of discerning, envisioning, and advising on the future direction of Israel. King David and all Israel depended on such insight. It's no different for churches today.

We, at FPC, need our own "tribe of Issachar" made up of "two hundred chiefs!" Thankfully, we have them! As part of the Faith Forward initiative, we have assembled a Vision Team, who will be leading our church through the visioning phase of Faith Forward. Beginning in the Fall, the Vision Team will convene at a series of retreats where they will be discerning and updating our church's mission, vision, and values (our "True North") to help the church know with greater clarity who we are becoming. They will also be helping us to create alignment to our True North by crafting a "roadmap" outlining the path to becoming that future church. The Vision Team, like the chiefs of Issachar, will be helping us to understand the times so we will know what to do. Instead of two hundred chiefs, our Vision Team is made up of 25 people, comprised of the Session, the senior staff, and other leaders of the congregation. Following the guidance of our consultants, the Session approved the following Team members:



## REHEMA FOR KIDS Building the Founders' Home

#### What are "In Step Children's Home" and "Rehema for Kids"?

The In Step Children's Home is located in Kitale, Kenya, and is a faith-based home to 209 abandoned, abused, and orphaned children. Rehema for Kids is the parent organization located in Washington state. Daniel Traina from our church is on the Board of Directors.

#### How has First Pres supported the Children's Home?

Our church has organized many mission trips to Kenya where we sponsored volunteer dental teams, built clinics, dormitories, and sidewalks. Our missionary participants have taught classes, helped children conduct science experiments, conducted soccer drills, and held many babies. Our financial donations have been used for a new dining hall and, most recently, to build a needed girls' dormitory.

#### Who are Carla and Jeff Picicci?

"Mama" Carla and "Baba" Jeff left their lives in Pasco, Washington, in 2003 for mission work with Kenyan water projects. In 2006, a local pastor came to them with a message which came to him in a dream that their work is not done in Kenya. Shortly after that, Carla and Jeff were blessed with an abandoned baby which they named Rehema, followed that same week by two more infants. The pair realized the Lord called them to open a children's home.

Since the first baby arrived, Rehema for Kids has rescued and raised hundreds of children at the In Step Children's Home. They are provided a loving home, quality education, nutritious meals, medical intervention, trauma counseling, and Biblical discipling that gives children the hope of Jesus and a chance to break the cycle of poverty. They are the only children's home in the region that funds each child's high school education, college, or trade school and as a result, several graduates are now working in the community and contributing to the betterment of society. They are working in childcare, construction, information technology, and one is currently enrolled in culinary school.

#### What facilities are on the In Step Home campus?

The village consists of several children's dormitories, primary and junior high school, medical clinic, dairy, and greenhouses. The farm and dairy provide for most of their needs. A special needs center, Stepping Stones, cares for a dozen or more highly disabled infants and children. Mama Carla and Baba Jeff live in a 200 sq ft. room adjacent to the nursery and administrative offices.

#### **Building the Founders' Home**

Carla and Jeff have consistently declined to have a home built for their use. They felt strongly that resources should be used for the children, building dorms, schools, and security fencing. The time has come for the Piciccis to have space for themselves and for future administrators when the couple retires. The Founders' Home has been partially funded.

#### How can I help?

Dan Harrison is heading the drive to raise \$20,000 to finish the construction. Donations or RMD from your IRA can be directed to First Presbyterian Church Pittsford marked "Rehema for Kids Founders' Home."

#### The day includes:


- A quart basket for each registrant to pick some fresh blueberries—the blueberry patch is a very short drive from the orchard shop
