CHARTING THE COURSE WITH PASTOR AARON

I've been recently reading the New York Times Bestseller *Atomic Habits: An Easy and Proven Way to Build Good Habits and Break Bad Ones* by James Clear. I find the title compelling because of the two connotations the word "atomic" carries. My immediate thought when I hear the word "atomic" is the incredible and explosive energy created from nuclear fission, as in the phrase "atomic bomb." The other thought I have when I hear the word "atomic" has to do with "atoms," or the smallest units of matter that make up everything around us (I know that definition isn't technically correct). When I think of those two concepts together, I think, "The smallest things can release extraordinary power," which is, actually, an apt summary of the book.

The author describes how making big, positive changes in your life depends on small, incremental adjustments. If you think to yourself, "I watch too much TV, and I want to watch less TV," you probably won't succeed in watching less TV if you depend on sheer willpower. However, if you make one little change (like storing your TV remote somewhere away from the TV) and then gradually build on that change over time, your chances of success increase.

In Philippians 3:10, Paul writes, "I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection." The Greek word he uses for "power" in that verse is the word *dunamis*, which is the etymological root for our English word "dynamite." Have you ever thought of the power of Christ's resurrection as being "dynamic" or even "explosive"? What if we began to think of it as the "atomic" power of resurrection?

In this season of Eastertide, you and I are reminded that we are people of the resurrection. We are in a process of salvation at the end of which is going to be the dynamic and explosive destruction of death itself, leaving only the possibility of endless life. That's where our journey is heading, but how do we live into that future reality now? The answer is: one incremental change at a time. What is one small decision you can make today that will help you live more fully into the coming and complete fulfillment of your salvation? It could be devising a plan to spend more time in prayer, attend worship more regularly, become a church leader, join a church group, feed the hungry, or offer forgiveness. I encourage you to read this newsletter carefully to possibly discover an opportunity to do just that, because the small decisions we make today can have eternal impacts on us and the people around us.


