

Backpack Ministry - It's For the Kids!

Our church has been providing weekend meals to kids at two schools in the City School district. This ministry helps children get the food and nourishment they need on the weekends when they are not in school, via backpacks delivered to their school every Friday during the school year. We have been working with School 54 and School 35 in Rochester to reach a number of kids that are considered at "extreme risk of hunger". These are kids who, without help, likely would go hungry on Saturday and Sunday.

This is our 11th year of driving this program. We have been blessed with a number of wonderful people in our congregation who have donated time, effort, money, and food to help us reach these needy children. Unfortunately, the problem does not go away. Rochester is now #3 in the country in terms of childhood poverty rate: 56.4%, three times the national average! (Rochester D&C) Volunteers are needed to deliver to the schools on Fridays. It simply means picking up the food at church and delivering to one or both schools. It doesn't require a lot of time, but our program is entirely dependent upon those deliveries. If you'd like to volunteer, contact Dave Testa at dtesta@rochester.rr.com or 585-355-2000. Because we now buy prepacked bags of food from Foodlink, monetary donations are especially welcome. Each pack of food costs approximately \$4.00 and we deliver about 56 per week—that's a great value, considering each pack provides lunches and dinners and snacks for the weekend. If you choose to donate, please give or mail a check to the church office made out to First Presbyterian (please note "backpack program" on your check). \$25 would feed six kids on the weekend. Regardless of how you help, we know it will make a difference in the lives of these children.

Bible and Book Study Sundays after Worship

Romans chapter 8 says: "Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves. Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord. Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practice hospitality.... If your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink. Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good."

Starting on October 16, after worship we will be discussing the book *Free-ing Congregational Mission: A Practical Vision for Companionship, Cultural Humility, and Co-Development*. This book explores how we as Christians can engage the world and be the hands and feet of Christ. It will both challenge us to be effective in ministry as well as challenge us to be more Christ-like. We will meet after the 10 am worship on October 16, 23, 30, November 6, and 13.

Then on **November 19, the book's authors B. Hunter Farrell and S. Balajiedlang Khyllep** will be in Fellowship Hall to help us put into context what this vision of companionship means in our lives and our church. This educational day will have two lectures, one at 9 am and one at 10:30 am.
