## Embracing and Sharing Christ's Love

#### CHARTING THE COURSE WITH PASTOR AARON

When the early Christians were seeing tremendous growth in the church (3,000 people becoming Christians in a single day!), we're told that they devoted themselves to studying the teachings of the Apostles and praying together (Acts 2:42). Prayer was an incredibly important spiritual discipline in those early years. In fact, it has always been important and even necessary for the church's vitality. I recently finished reading the autobiography of Presbyterian minister and revivalist Charles Finney, and he insisted that focused, intentional, and wide-spread prayer was a necessary component for the success of his revivals that spread across New York State in the 19th century. Through prayer, we focus on God and God's will, and, when we align our hearts with God's will, amazing things can happen. It is no wonder, then, that Jesus himself frequently separated from the crowds to find a place to pray (Luke 5:16). It is only when our hearts are aligned with God's will that it becomes true what Jesus said in Mark 11:24: "Whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours."

In my view, the Faith Forward initiative we have begun is all about seeking a revival of the Holy Spirit in First Presbyterian Church and throughout Greater Rochester. Through Faith Forward, we will be taking account of ourselves as a church and asking, "What ought to matter most?" Through asking ourselves that question, we also want to profess to God, "Thy will be done." This is the posture of seeking a revival, and this is the power of prayer.

In the July/August issue of *The Good News*, I introduced you to the 25 members of our Faith Forward Vision Team. Their job is to lead us in discerning and updating our church's mission, vision, and values (our "True North") to help the church know with greater clarity who we are becoming. They will also be helping us to create alignment to our True North by crafting a "roadmap" outlining the path to becoming that future church. Their work begins at a retreat on September 30 and October 1. In an earnest desire for revitalization and revival, I think it is necessary for us – the whole church – to be in heartfelt prayer for the Vision Team as they prepare for their work.

Toward that end, I invite you to participate in 20 Days of Prayer and Fasting for the Faith Forward initiative. Beginning on Sunday, September 10 (which is the start of our program year) and ending on Friday, September 29 (the day before the Vision Team retreat), you will have the daily opportunity to spend a brief, focused time praying that the Vision Team listens for and hears the voice of God. For that purpose, I have created the "20-Day Faith Forward Devotional." In this devotional, there is a short reading and a prayer for each of the 20 days. On Sunday, September 3, you can pick up a hard copy of the devotional either after worship or in the office during the week. The church office can email you a PDF copy of the devotional if you prefer. You will also be able to access a daily podcast version of the 20-day devotional. The 20-Day Faith Forward Devotional is meant to walk you step-by-step through a focused time of reflection and prayer as we begin this next phase of the Faith Forward journey.

Additionally, every Thursday during those twenty days, we will be meeting in our chapel from 7:00-7:30 am for a time of guided prayer and meditation. I will also be encouraging you to fast in addition to praying. Jesus taught us to fast (Matthew 6:16-18), and fasting helps to focus us on our need for God and for prayer. I will be fasting from all food on those days, and I encourage you to do the same thing, some kind of limited fasting, or a version of fasting that will be safe and healthy for you.

I truly desire for a revival of the Holy Spirit in my own life and in our church as a result of the Faith Forward process. I ask you to join me in praying for it, too.


#### **Fall Deacon Events**

This summer we served 200 campers in our sleepaway camp program. As part of our outreach to Rochester urban ministries, we enrolled five campers from Family Promise of Monroe County. Funding for their camperships (\$1,875) was made possible via the donations from First Pres. We also hosted 39 participants and chaperones from Cameron Community Ministries for swimming, slip and slide, tractor rides, archery, Gaga game, boat rides on Seneca Lake and lunch. The cost of their visit to Camp Whitman was \$1,188 and your gift assisted with our ongoing connection to Cameron.

## Youth Ministry News!

By the time this newsletter is published all families in grades 6-12 will have received a paper copy and digital copies of this year's schedule. The schedule is designed carefully with the purpose of creating a program that your youth will want to engage. It is our desire for youth to have a strong understanding of God and Church Community before they leave for college.

### FPC Youth 2023-2024 "Inside, Outside, Upside Down"

Our theme for the year is "Inside, Outside, Upside Down" - meaning that roughly each month we have tried to include events related to these themes:

**INSIDE** - faith formation via Youth Group Fellowship events / Bible Study / 6th-12th grade FORUM

**OUTSIDE** - fellowship and fun events outside our walls to build relationships among our youth

**UPSIDE DOWN** - mission events that remind our young people that God has called us to serve the world as the hands and feet of Christ, because Christ created an "upside down kingdom" where the first will be last and the last will be first

These activities are intended to build community where there is none. Every event has "group building" components to help youth from different schools and different social groups to interact with each other and identify as friends. We know in the beginning kids may be reluctant if they can't find "friends" who are going. We hope if they attend these events they will soon find their friendships grow with the people who do attend.

Some of these events seem like "just fun activities" - in order to include kids on the margins who may be reluctant to come, many activities will be advertised and seem like they will be all fun and games. As a parent, please don't let this fool you. These activities are advertised this way to grow the group, and introduce new kids into who we are and what we do. Every event will include prayer, disciple building, and group building activities.

Although many of these activities will include a time to reflect on our faith, these activities will not necessarily contain a "Bible Study" as adults would recognize it. Most of our youth have learned from the Bible for many years. The studies in these courses will focus on "what difference does it make" or "what's the point?". Kids in Youth Group have matured to start asking the hard questions. The Bible can help us answer these questions, but at this age youth, like Abraham in the Bible, need to struggle with their faith and how being a person of faith can change their lives.

#### FPC 6th-12th Grade FORUM on Sundays from 10-11 am

FORUM will be taught by either Pastor Jacobson, Pastor Neff, or Craig Kunkle the Sundays noted on the schedule. As has been our practice for several years, on Communion Sundays and holidays 6th-12th graders will worship with their family.
