A WEE WORD FROM DR. WEENINK

More Than A Mere A-B-C – 1-2-3!!!

At the beginning of this year, at a well-attended officers' retreat, the decision was made to enter into a self-study that would incorporate both quantitative and qualitative methodologies. There were multiple inquiries asking how long it would all take. At that point in time it was a difficult forecast to make. There was, however, an "in-a-perfect-world" scenario offered. It was an ambitious timeline. The "in-a-perfect-world" projection was to have all our self-study complete, published, and approved by July. I shuddered at the very suggestion that came out of my mouth. Then, some rather remarkable things happened. The Appreciative Inquiry interviews were completed by Easter. Between Easter and Pentecost, the Congregational Assessment Tool (C.A.T.) was administered, analyzed, and interpreted. Your Mission Study Task Force composed, edited, refined, and revised a final Mission Study document by mid-June. It was approved by Session and Genesee Valley Presbytery's Committee on Ministry by the end of June. We exceeded our hopes and expectations and completed our self-study phase in advance of our ambitious, self-imposed deadline. That makes the way clear now for the election of a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC).

While interim/transitional journeys never follow a precise timetable, the election of a PNC has us 'kicking-the-can' well on into a turning point in this time of transition. Please note the checkmarks by each colorful circle in the Transitional Journey chart at the end of this article. You will note that we hover somewhere near the halfway mark. I don't want to pop your bubble, but, I hasten to advise that the circles do not reflect chronology. They represent benchmarks of accomplishment along the way. I would love to tell you that we have a timetable and a deadline to find a new pastor, but this is not our timetable. As I like to say: "We plan and God laughs." In all the hustle and bustle of crafting the Mission Study and forming the PNC it can be easy to forget that these are merely tools, instruments in God's process of calling a new pastor to this congregation. This is God's process, a process on God's timetable, a process with purpose; our purpose is to seek out, identify, and select the one whom God is already raising up to be the next called pastor for the First Presbyterian Church of Pittsford. This all happens in the fullness of God's time.

Now that we have met our "in-a-perfect-world" deadline, the Nominating Committee has been diligent in its work to identify a slate of nominees to serve on the Pastor Nominating Committee. In considering a slate of nominees to propose, your Nominating Committee has strived to find individuals who are representative of the whole congregation.

They have looked for church members of integrity who are:

- knowledgeable about the church and community, Presbyterian theology, and government;
- able to make a significant commitment of their time, energy, and very best wisdom;



- willing to accept this as a task of spiritual discernment, not being easily influenced by personal desires or congregational politics, but rather listening for the voice of God; and
- able to honor confidentiality. The congregation is well served in giving careful and prayerful attention to the election of persons to serve in this important role. Each of you are invited to give your voice and vote to this decision.

The Session has called a Congregational Meeting for Sunday, September 9, (following 10:00 am worship) for the purpose of electing the PNC – Pastor Nominating Committee.

Upon election, the PNC will be oriented by a representative from Genesee Valley Presbytery’s Committee on Ministry. The Rev. Harry Heintz will serve in this capacity. He will guide, counsel, and advise the work of the PNC. The Interim Pastor, Session, or other staff will have no involvement with the PNC’s work.

As the PNC organizes itself for its important work, they will develop a Ministry Information Form (MIF). Our thorough and complete Mission Study document will be a valuable resource for completing the MIF. The MIF provides a narrative picture of the mission and ministry of First Presbyterian Church of Pittsford and our sense of call. Additionally, the MIF describes our demographics, history, theology, values, leadership needs, and expectations. Prospective pastors will use the MIF and the entire Mission Study document to help discern whether God is calling them to serve this fellowship of faith.

The Ministry Information Form, once completed and approved, will be submitted to the denomination’s Church Leadership Connection (CLC). The CLC is an important tool in the overall call process; it is a web-based system in compliance with the Book of Order that provides global access and visibility to all potential candidates to see our ‘open pulpit’ and our MIF. The MIF ultimately becomes the job posting within the Presbyterian system (CLC) where searching candidates can read and see what we are all about and make the decision if they would like to apply.

Through the Church Leadership Connection, our Ministry Information Form will be matched with the Personal Information Form (PIF) of interested Pastoral candidates. Those involved in past pastoral searches, you may have referred to these as a dossier or simply a resume. We will continue with the alphabet soup, and go with PIF. So, in summation, the PNC completes a MIF, the COM approves and forwards it to the CLC to be matched with PIFs.

Interested clergy can submit their (PIF) Personal Information Form a couple of ways. One, through the CLC which matches seeking candidates with posted open positions via an automated process. The second and most common PIF submission are self-referrals. Clergy can review the CLC website, see our vacant position and submit their PIF directly to the PNC. The latter is a more confidential process that protects currently employed pastors who might not want their current congregation or others to know that they're looking.

During this time, the PNC diligently reviews each and every PIF received. It is not unusual for some PNC's to evaluate 100-200 PIFs. Initial screening and review looks for the experience, education, and theological alignment as required by First Presbyterian Church of Pittsford. (This is why our Mission Study process was so pivotal!) Once prospective candidates are considered qualified, the PNC digs a little deeper and reads a statement of faith or seeks out a recorded sermon or blog. The PNC members review and score each candidate independently; the top scoring candidates are then discussed in group sessions to determine if they are First Presbyterian Church of Pittsford worthy and eligible to advance to the next stage. Subsequent stages will include more questions, interaction, interviews, and eventually some visits. This is, in a nutshell, the important work of the PNC you will elect.

Congregational involvement through the self-study phase of transition was intentionally active. The search phase of transition is not passive. All of us collectively can continue to "kick-the-can" well past this turning point in this time of transition. In-a-perfect-world (remember that?!), everyone should participate in and support fully the on-going ministry that continues to take place in our midst. Everyone should, on a daily basis, pray for the PNC's work and the discernment process.

The PNC will be providing regular updates. Watch the bulletin, *Good News*, and Sunday morning announcements, and Web-site link (under the tab – About) to stay on top of their progress. Because the PNC will be talking to pastors who are often currently employed, much of their work will be highly confidential. While the PNC cannot speak about any of the candidates, they will regularly update us on the general progress of the search. The most important contribution you can provide is prayer. Please don't pressure them or pump them for information. It is an enormous task. They will be carrying enough weight. Please pray for the PNC members' faith, patience, endurance, and joy in their work; and that God's will would be made clear to them in their discernment. Pray too for our next pastor and your church family as God prepares us for each other.

It's all more than alphabet soup. It's waaaaaaaay more than A-B-C – 1-2-3!



Our Mission Partners in Taiwan

On October 7, World Communion and Peacemaking Sunday, we will welcome the Rev. Dr. Jonathan and Dr. Emily Seitz, our new mission partners in Taiwan. Jonathan and Carrie Mitchell met while they were at Princeton Seminary and he began his ministry with Emily in Taiwan in 2009. Jonathan teaches at the Taiwan Theological Seminary in Taipei, the capital of Taiwan. Most of Jonathan's students are preparing for pastoral ministry. Jonathan teaches classes related to mission, religion, and world Christianity. Emily's background includes a mix of social work, volunteering, and librarianship. Emily did her M.LIS. and Ph.D. at Rutgers University (N.J.), working at several public libraries along the way. Emily is a visiting fellow this year at Aletheia University, a Presbyterian university in Tamsui.

The Presbyterian Church of Taiwan, which invited Jonathan and Emily to service, traces its history to English and Canadian missions that began in the 1860s and 1870s. About 90 missionaries from the PC(USA) (or its predecessors) have served in Taiwan during the last 70 years.

Caty Pech Mission Visitor from Yucatan

Many of you had an opportunity to meet Caty Pech from the Island of Cozumel Q. Roo, Mexico. Caty has been an on-site coordinator for Tres M Ministerios for the past two decades, an elementary teacher, a graduate of San Pablo Presbyterian Seminary and serves as a pastor for an English speaking congregation that nests in a local Presbyterian Church where she lives. Caty spent time with the Vacation Bible School children, led a Cooking-with-Caty for the cooking club, facilitated a banner making project and assisted in our worship life. Caty was also able to teach us about her advocacy for the emerging role for women in the National Evangelical Presbyterian Church of Mexico. Members have the opportunity to re-connect with Caty when a mission team makes its way into the Yucatan for a mission immersion/work/study/cultural exchange January 26-February 2, 2019.






